Religion and life includes learning about the origins of the universe and human life, environmental issues, animal rights and testing, abortion , euthanasia and death and the afterlife .		Islam – Practices 4 th January – 2 nd April The final unit on Muslim practices builds upon the work of Islam: Beliefs and teachings learned about in year 10. It is the final knowledge and content needed to complete the exam successfully. Islam practices includes learning about the five pillars of Islam, Jihad and important Muslim festivals.
