## Subjects and Qualifications

- Vocational awards are work-related qualifications suitable for a wide range of students. Typically, students need to complete controlled assessments and examinations throughout the two years.
- GCSEs are more traditional qualifications assessed solely by exam at the end of Year 11.
- Both types of qualification are considered "high value" and accepted by employers and further educational establishments across the country.


## The English Baccalaureate

- The English Baccalaureate is awarded to any student who secures good (Level 5+) GCSE passes in English, Mathematics, Science, a language (Mandarin or French) and a humanity (History or Geography).
- This full combination of GCSEs at grades 5 or above will entitle you to a certificate recording your achievement.
- We will be discussing this route with identified students.

## What we tell our students

- choose courses you know you will enjoy
- choose courses you are interested in
- choose a range of different courses, so that you have a broad base from which to choose your post-16 courses
- read the subject information very carefully
- ask the advice of your subject teachers and Form Tutor
- discuss it with your parents


## What we tell our students

- choose a course simply because your friends have
- allow either you 'like’ or 'dislike’ of particular teachers to influence your choice
- choose a course because you think it might be easy
- drop any subject you may require for entry to a particular occupation or course
